



POLICY CONTEXT BRIEFS

Mission: This series publishes working papers designed to provide policy makers with the critical contextual information and conditions informing both real and potential international development projects. The papers will address the current challenges facing the international donor community as it tries to pursue peaceful, democratic, and technically sound approaches to sustainable development. Particular but not exclusive emphasis will be given to the Pacific Basin region. Authors are encouraged to consider developing their briefs into a book-length project as part of the PBRC's series on Politics, Economics, and Inclusive Development with Palgrave MacMillan.

Guidelines: Papers should be grounded in at least one specific case study, but provide key insights into general cases with similar contexts. They should impart information and guidance about what one must understand to create a successful policy in the context described. Papers for this series should fit within the field of international development research, which can include topics such as natural resource management, conflict management, public health, food security, and intellectual property regulations, among many others. All papers should be 15 pages in length, about 5,000-7,000 words long.

Internal Review: All papers will be reviewed by PBRC internal staff prior to publication.

Form of Publication: All papers in the series will be published on the PBRC website (www.pbrc.soka.edu) under the heading PBRC *Working Paper Series: Policy Contexts*. These papers will be an available open-source.
